


[Plantation year 1st April to 31st March]





DOWN TO EARTH Gardening is a de-stressor for many professionals in Bangalore

and tending to them for the first few years so they quickly form a dense canopy, allowing native shrubs to thrive underneath. Patches planted by Afforestt in Whitefield and Nelamangala are now healthy ecosystems that attract birds and animals.

Ironically, many of these green warriors have lived in Bangalore for less than a decade. Kapil Sharma, another passionate tree planter, has helped plant 8,000 trees across Bangalore through his NGO, Saytrees.

For many, the need to welcome their children into the green fold is a powerful impulse to start gardening, says Sriharsha, whose rooftop greenhouse yields everything from beefsteak tomatoes to Swiss chard An engineer with Impelsys, a digital publishing solutions company, Sharma set up Saytrees in 2007 when he saw huge numbers of trees being felled for Metro work and road widening projects. With increasing participation from volunteers and corporate support, Sharma and his four associates have scaled up rapidly in the past year, planting as many as 3,000 seedlings along Bangalore's lakes and highways and in schools and parks. "We identify areas that are bereft of trees and get the required permissions from civic authorities before we plant. Once the rains start, we invite volunteers to join us every weekend and continue planting mature saplings till December," he says. "The rest of the year, we water and monitor the saplings planted." This year, Saytrees hopes to plant over 5,000 trees and make a bid for creating mini-gardens between Metro pillars. This is just the beginning, says the 31-year-old. "Bangalore is waking up to a green future."

A two-year-old trust, Saytrees draws its name from the phrase 'say cheese'. The group started as an informal Bangalore Tree Planting Group with a handful of techies coming together to plant trees in a big way. The green enthusiasts initially funded their own

activities but soon corporate funding started coming their way as several corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives adopted their replanting drives.

Planting ideas: The activists get saplings from BBMP and forest nurseries and plant them along lake beds, apartment complexes, schools and colleges. They have planted saplings along the Intermediate Ring Road connecting Indiranagar with Ejipura. They also step in where BBMP's plantation drives fail and take up re-planting. The group uses social media to boost their activities. "We mostly prefer local species as they are the best in terms of survival. Then there is the obvious ecological advantage of attracting birds etc when it is a native species. Exotics are good on road medians," says Balbir Bora, founding member of Saytrees.

A sapling of hope AMID DWINDLING TREE COVER

n The efforts of one natureloving techie from Chhattisgarh, founder of the SayTrees Environmental Trust, have resulted in nearly 15,000 healthy trees being planted across the city Kapil Sharma, who has been in Bengaluru for 12 years now, was struck by the number of trees being felled for the metro rail work back in 2007.

Disturbed by the trend, he spent his time running between government offices, trying to get them to change their minds. Naturally, that didn't work, so he decided to do something constructive instead. On Saturday, over 400 people joined hands with the trust to plant close to 1,500 trees over 400,000 square feet in the army land adjoining Bellandur Lake in Koramangala. This has brought them closer to their target of planting 10,000 trees in 2014 – the tally now stands at about 6,500.

Kapil Sharma and Sumant Parmar also a techie, are now close friends, apart from being neighbours and running Saytrees together. Over the last seven years, the trust has worked closely with the government, the BBMP, corporates

and the public to restore Bengaluru's once verdant network of trees. "I was handing CSR for a company here and we were interested in planting trees," said Parmar.

"That's when I found Saytrees online, but I didn't know that my next-door neighbour Kapil Sharma, whom I often played cricket with, was the same person who founded the trust," laughed Parmar. Both men have held on to their day jobs and dedicated their weekends to their NGO. However, the trust has grown so fast so quickly that they now find themselves putting in three or four hours of work everyday, to meet their plantation targets.

gets. "I would travel 50 km a day to work, from Vijaynagar to the Outer Ring Road," said Sharma, as he describes his journey into social work. "When the Metro work had started, I noticed that trees had



been felled across the entire stretch, which I really didn't like," he explained.

Tree plantation drives a dime-adozen and most of them make tall orders along the lines of planting a 100,000 saplings in a day. Compared with this, 15,000 trees over several years seems like a small number, but there is far, far more to it than meets the eye. Small saplings are usually the norm, but these require intensive care, need tree guards and usually fall prey to careless pedestrians, cattle or even heavy rains. Different areas need particular kinds of trees, if they are expected to survive

"We bring in very big saplings, technically small trees," said Parmar. "There are many benefits to doing this." Now this implies that there are a number of challenges as well, which, of course, include the cost. The larger the sapling, the higher the price and the saplings they bring in can cost up to four times as much as the small ones. They are sourced from across the state, because Sharma is very particular about the species and the size.

"People think planting trees is as simple as digging holes in the grounds and sticking the saplings in them," said Sharma. "What we do, however, requires extensive planning." Considering the size and the weight of the saplings, a single person will find it very difficult to do more than one. Pits are up to four feet deep and they are usually prepared in advance with JCBs. Planting trees is all very well and even if these have a higher survival rate than a baby sapling, they need up to six months of maintenance. To deal with this, June to December are dedicated to planting, while only maintenance is done up to May, to help the trees make it through the harshest, driest months. "Summers in Bengaluru are not what they used to be, they're as hot as North India now," said Sharma.

Even maintenance is done at a formidable cost, because the only source of water is from tankers. During summer months, these are more expensive than normal and most tanker drivers don't have the patience to wait around until every sapling is watered. All this is nonnegotiable, as far as Parmar and Sharma are concerned. For them quality and survival are of the utmost importance.

Their ultimate aim is to use treated water sourced from apartments and the BWSSB to water the saplings, but this is still a work in progress.

Corporates usually volunteer to fund the drives, but according to Sharma and Parmar, they never ask for more than Rs 200 per tree. "Even this amount, people are not willing to give," said Parmar. "That's the mentality we're dealing with - we want the best and we want to get it cheap!"

Interestingly, although they have been in the field for seven years now, the entire trust is managed by those hailing from North India. This has been a huge hassle, for Parmar has only been in the city for three years and speaks hardly any Kannada, while Sharma can manage the basics. "Working with government officials is actually that much harder," admitted Sharma. "We have one local – Shiva, who sometimes acts as a translator. The only South Indian on our team is Nanda Kumar, who comes from Tamil Nadu!"

This is an awkward observation to make, no doubt, that too coming from a Bengalurean, but we're all happy to blame our immigrant population for ruining the city, because it's easier to shift responsibility on someone we call an outsider. The work that this team does, however, is more than commendable and they have stuck by it, difficult though it can get at times.

"There have been days when we sit down and tell ourselves that we're going to end this, because drives are often cancelled at the last moment, sometimes after we have received our saplings which will all die if they aren't planted soon enough," said Parmar. "But then, we have a successful drive and we realise that no matter what, it's totally worth it in the end!"
